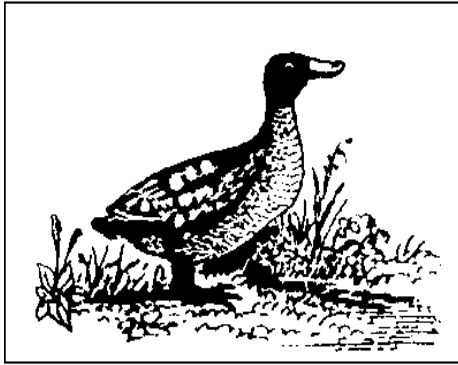


## Match a Patch



This game is designed to practice reading words with the longer spellings of /k/, /ch/, and /j/ as we meet them in short words following single short vowels: ck, tch, and dge

**Directions:** First laminate and cut out the “word patches” printed below. Place a pile of word patches upside down in the middle of the table. In turn, players draw a word-patch and turn it right-side-up. If a word can be made with another patch already face up on the table, they read the word and slide it to their side of the table. When time is up or when there are no match-able patches left, the player with the most connected words is the winner. If players are up for another round, repeat the game using Set Two. Many of these words may be a little harder to read, but needing help does not affect the luck of making a word.

## Match a Patch



### Set Two for more practice reading ck, tch, and dge words

**Directions:** First laminate and cut out the “word patches” printed below. Place a pile of word patches upside down in the middle of the table. In turn, players draw a word-patch and turn it right-side-up. If a word can be made with another patch already face up on the table, they read the word and slide it to their side of the table. When time is up or when there are no match-able patches left, the player with the most connected words is the winner.
