The challenge in any collecting is in guessing what will be the most valuable in the end. If your grandfather bought this famous painting when it was new and unknown, your family might be rich right now.

Whether we win or not, word collecting can help us read and write about anything in the world including how we feel about this painting! In this game, each player is going to gamble on collecting either adjective-maker suffixes or meaning changer prefixes. Here's how it goes:

Directions:

- Cut out the word cards printed below, shuffle them together, and place them in a pile, upside down in the middle of the table.
- Players agree on which collecting chart to take, and then. . .
- In turn, they draw one word from the middle of the table, they read the word, and use it in a sentence, perhaps talking about the arctic painting.
- If a player draws a word that belongs on the other player's chart, they have to hand it over.
- Bit by bit the columns will fill up, and the first one to have one of the columns completely filled is the winner.
- If time is up before anyone has a complete column, then the winner is the one with the longest column of words.
