




Sight Word Scramble


Here's an idea that could be adapted for any words in any language at any level of difficulty. In this case, the phrases include all the sight words that challenged one particular student at one moment in time. Each phrase was given a number so the cards could be used in place of a roll of a die in a trail game as well as in a matching Bingo game. Print extra copies of the sentence grid, so each player can fill his own board, and the extra grids can be cut out for playing cards. Recreate, the phrases to practice whatever is needed.


Another way to add appeal to this practice is to tape the sentence strips onto small blocks such as Jenga tower blocks. After each block's sentence is read, the block can be added to a tower or to any block design.
